Matthew 1:1-17

- 1. It was not unusual to begin a document with the individual's genealogy
- 2. **Matthew 1:1** The record of the genealogy of Jesus the Messiah, the son of David, the son of Abraham:
 - A. The record or book of the genealogy (KJV "Generation")
 - 1. Greek: Genesis
 - 2. Means beginning, origin, lineage, birth (See Matthew 1:18)
- 3. Three sections of the genealogy.
 - A. Abraham to David (Man was born for greatness)
 - B. David to Babylonian captivity (Man lost his greatness)
 - C. Captivity to Christ (Man can regain his greatness)
- 4. Jesus, descendent of David
 - A. Peter testifies: Acts 2:29-30
 - B. Paul: Romans 1:3; 2 Timothy 2:8
 - C. John: Revelation 22:16
- 5. Jesus, fulfillment of prophecy
- 6. The pedigree
 - A. Names of women were not typically included in genealogies
 - 1. Rahab was a prostitute (Joshua 2:1-7)
 - 2. Ruth was a Moabitess, not Jewish (Ruth 1:4; Deuteronomy 23:3)
 - 3. Tamar was an adulteress (Genesis 38)
 - 4. Bathsheba was seduced by King David, and her husband, Uriah was murdered

B. Breaking barriers (Jew and Gentile, male and female, saint and sinner)

- 1. Marriage in biblical times
 - A. Engagement.
 - B. Betrothal.
 - C. Marriage.
- 2. Conceived of the Holy Spirit
 - A. Matthew understood this as a fulfillment of prophecy
 - 1. Isaiah 7:14
 - B. "Conceived by the Holy Spirit"
- 1. Genesis 1:2 And the earth was a formless and desolate emptiness, and darkness was over the surface of the deep, and the Spirit of God was hovering over the surface of the waters.
 - 2. Jesus: Jehovah saves
 - 3. Immanuel: God with us
