Who was Pilate? - Cruel, imperious, and insensitive governor of Judea - He hated his Jewish subjects and his job - Would simply kill people when they rioted.

Portrait #3 of blood guilt: The crowd preferred a murderous "hero" over their Messiah, who exhorted them to love their enemies and said he would die as a ransom for many.
Matthew 27:24-26 Portrait #4 of blood guilt: Pilate's action was not prompted by desire for justice but by political and moral cowardice and fear of a mob.
V 26 - Scourged/flogged - A horrific Roman judicial penalty, consisting of a severe beating with a multi-lashed whip containing embedded pieces of bone and metal.
