Matthew 9:1-8
Location: Jesus traveled by boat from Gergesa to Capernaum across the Sea of Galilee.
Jesus response to the paralytic: "Take heart, your sins are forgiven."
Why did the scribes think Jesus was blaspheming?
Sickness and sin.
How was the response of the scribes different from the response of the people?
Matthew 9:9
Why was Matthew an unlikely candidate for becoming a disciple?
Matthew 9:10-13
Two kinds of people in Israel: the pious and the people of the land
The Pharisees asked the disciples, "Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and sinners?" What was Jesus' answer?
The marks of the Pharisees:
1. They were more concerned about their own than in others.
2. They were more concerned with than with encouragement.
3. They practiced a goodness that produced condemnation rather than and forgiveness.
4. They practiced a religion that consisted of orthodoxy rather than inward transformation.
Hosea 6:6 For I desire steadfast love and not sacrifice, the knowledge of God rather than burnt offerings.
