7-8 How is Jesus' sacrifice on our behalf different than the sacrifice of a normal person?

9 Justified by His blood

"Justification" is the declaring of a person to be just or righteous.

"Salvation" is deliverance from the power and effects of sin and entrance into God's presence

10 We were enemies and we were reconciled to God

"Reconciliation" means a broken relationship was healed.

11 We rejoice . . . we have now received reconciliation

Three tenses of salvation.

Past. Justification. Romans 5:1

Present. Sanctification. Set apart for God's service.  
1 Corinthians 1:18; 2 Peter 3:18  
Future. Glorification. 1 Peter 1:5

Romans 12-21 Paul begins to compare Adam and Christ

12 Adam: Sin entered the world

13 People sinned before the law was given to Moses.

14 Death reigned from Adam to Moses.

Adam is a type of Christ

15 How are Adam and Christ similar?

Adam: Produced offense (transgression) affecting all  
Christ: Produced the free gift of salvation available to all

16 Adam's offense resulted in judgment and condemnation  
Christ's free gift which resulted from many offenses, resulted in justification

17 Through Adam's sin, death reigned  
Through Christ, we receive an abundance of grace and we will reign in life  
through Him

18 Through Adam's offense condemnation came to all  
Through Christ's righteous act, we receive the gift of right relationship with  
God (justification)

19 Through Adam's offense, many were made sinners  
Through Jesus' obedience many will be made righteous

20 Through Adam, sin abounded  
Through Christ, grace abounded even more!  
How does the law relate to these facts?

21 Sin reigned in death

Physical death and spiritual death  
Grace reigns through righteousness (right relationship with God) to eternal  
life (physical and spiritual) through Jesus Christ our Lord
